MIKE SHUSTER is an award-winning diplomatic correspondent and roving foreign correspondent for NPR News. You heard his broadcasts from Tehran and Dubai, where he reported on the June 12 election and the street protests and turmoil that followed. Now President Ahmadinejad has been sworn into office for a second term, nearly two months after the disputed election.

Mike Shuster has helped shape NPR's extensive coverage of the Middle East as one of the leading reporters to cover this region. Shuster has traveled frequently to the Middle East, including Iran, Iraq, Afghanistan, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Israel and Gaza. He did a series on Shi'ite faith and politics, providing a comprehensive look at the complexities of the Islamic religion and its impact on the Western world. Shuster has won many awards for his reporting, and was part of the NPR News team to be recognized with a Peabody Award for coverage of September 11 and its aftermath.

Through his reporting for NPR, he has also taken listeners to India and Pakistan, the Central Asian nations of Uzbekistan, Turkmenistan and Tajikistan, and the Congo. He was NPR's senior Moscow correspondent in the 1990s. He has been based in New York and in England. Now based at NPR West, he covers issues of nuclear non-proliferation, weapons of mass destruction, terrorism, and the Pacific Rim.
